

MOUD & MAUD

Medications for opioid use disorder (MOUD) and medications for alcohol use disorder (MAUD) help control withdrawal symptoms and cravings. Without these medications, 90% of individuals with Opioid Use Disorder (OUD) relapse within one year.



About MOUD & MAUD

These medications decrease the relapse rate by 50% at one year for those with OUD, and this percentage increases when psychosocial interventions are included.

MOUD has been a standard of care since 2014 and supports sustained recovery, pairing therapy with FDA-approved medication, to treat substance use disorders and prevent opioid overdose.

There are many forms of MOUD which can be used for both OUD and Alcohol Use Disorder (MAUD).

Pharmacotherapy for Opioid Use Disorder (POD)

The POD HEDIS® measure assesses members aged 16 and older with a diagnosis of Opioid Use Disorder (OUD) with a new OUD pharmacotherapy event and on the medication for at least 180 days.
